




# Why do we go online?

Children and young people go online to connect with friends, and make new ones, to browse the internet for information, chat with others and play games.				
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


# Where our information goes...






Some things are ok as long as we are not sharing any personal information for example, something that we would not walk up to a stranger in the street and tell them. Have a look at the next slide to understand personal information



# What is "Personal" information?








Personal information is anything a stranger can use to identify you. It is information that is particular to you or your family...

## What is "Personal" information?



**SELFIE -** Could be taken in your school uniform or next to your street sign which tells a stranger which school you attend or where you live



VIDEO/ LIVE STREAMING If you do this whilst gaming

it could show you entering passwords on your game. Live streaming whilst walking home from school again could show school badges or street names. You must always be aware of who or what else may be in the background of the video



at a sports club you attend or a park you visit with friends. By tagging yourself in certain locations you attend frequently a stranger would know your location.



Sharing rude images of children (someone under 18 years old) on the internet is against the law even if it is you in the picture.

The circumstances behind each crime are different which means you may not always be arrested. However a crime will be recorded on the police systems. The police can take your devices and reset them back to factory settings to remove any unsafe content on your devices in order to protect you and others.

# Consequences

Please remember that not only do we have laws specific to misusing a computer, laws in society can also apply to your behaviour on the internet including threatening and bullying communication.

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Please remember that not only do we have laws specific to misusing a computer, laws in society can also apply to your behaviour on the internet including threatening and bullying communication.

#### Young people getting involved with cyber crime could face:

- A visit and warning from police or National Crime Agency officers
- Devices can be seized, all content deleted and the device restored back to factory settings
- Computers being seized and being prevented from accessing the internet

- A penalty or fine
- Being arrested
- Up to life in prison for the most serious offences
- Or all of the above!

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

This is known as our digital footprint. We leave a footprint in everything we do on the internet.







## Alarm Bells!!

- I. A stranger has initiated the conversation
- 2. Profile child's gaming profile information is open to the public
- 3. Location details active a stranger is able to identify holiday activities and opportunities to take advantage of the child
- 4. Grooming the stranger is sending flattering messages and supportive messages to trick the child into sending an image
- 5. Grooming the stranger is sending a flattering reply to make the child feel special. This may make a child more likely to send more images if asked Tricking the child
- 6. Unknown internet links may be a virus or harmful content etc. Check web address to see if it looks suspicious (ww/.com.co)
- 7. Reward offering a reward to do something

If something feels wrong then it most likely is. Speak to a trusted adult who can help in these situations and NEVER arrange to meet anyone you have only met on the internet.

## Pressure!



There are lots of different reasons why people may feel like they have to send information or pictures to someone on the internet. It is important to remember to talk to a trusted adult and never be pressured to do so.

Demands to do something with threats if you don't

### Bullied

Hurtful behaviour that happens repeatedly with an imbalance of power or strength

### Peer Pressure

Influences / pressure from other young people to do something

### Tricked

Making you do something that you do not realise you are doing

### **Forced**

Making you feel you have no choice

The information we leave on the internet is like jigsaw pieces that make up who you are. The more pieces we leave then the easier it is for strangers to use that information for bad. Let's lock our information away and keep ourselves safe.
