Parent/Carer Feedback

Thank you to everyone who completed the Safeguarding Audit. We have had an overwhelming response. All responses have been thoroughly analysed. From your responses, we have been able to organise nurture, support and Bereavement counselling programmes for identified children and our Parent Support Advisor, Linda Lashley, is also working with a number of families and children.

You will also, by now, have received a letter outlining the date of your telephone consultation with your child's class teacher. Your child will bring home their appointment time tonight. This will be a ten-minute conversation with your child's class teacher and will provide an opportunity to discuss how your child has settled back into school after Lockdown.

Hot School Dinners

I am delighted that St. John Vianney school is in the first group of schools in the City to be able to offer hot meals to our children. Due to the restrictions of using the school hall for all of our children - only one bubble can eat their dinner in the Hall at one time and the Hall has to be thoroughly cleaned before the next bubble can enter - the school Cook has been advised that KS2 children across the city will be provided with their meal in a special food box and these will be eaten by KS2 children in their classrooms. Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 children will eat their dinner in the school Hall. If you wish your child to have a hot meal at dinner time and you did not receive the letter on Friday, please contact Mrs McDine in the school office.

Payments for School Dinners

Can I please ask that the correct dinner money or a cheque is sent into school in an envelope clearly labelled with your child's name on <u>MONDAY</u>. All money will now be banked on a Monday and dinner money must therefore be sent in every Monday as normal.

We are currently in the process of issuing new passwords to all of our pupils through Newcastle Civic Centre. As soon as these are ready, we will send them out as we would encourage online payment, if possible, in the current climate.

Prices of school dinners have been increased by Newcastle City Council for this academic year. Nursery meals will now cost £2.10 per day and Years 3, 4, 5, 6

meals will cost £2.20 per day. Universal grant will cover Rec, Y1 and Y2 so there will be no cost.

St. Cuthbert's Catholic High School
