School Meals Price Increase

Newcastle City Council has informed schools this week that from the Monday 7th April 2025, they are increasing the school catering charge to £3 per meal. St John Vianney Catholic Primary School and BBCET recognises this is a significant increase for parents from the current price. We all know the know the importance of a pupil receiving a hot, nutritious school meal. Consequently, we are doing what we can to limit the impact of this cost and have agreed to limit the price passed to parents to £2.70 until 1st April 2026.

Science Week

This week pupils from across school are joining in a wide variety of activities with a scientific theme to them. Please ask your child what sort of investigations they have watched Mr Peacock go through this week – there will be some specific challenges too...watch out for them on Facebook!

And so, to finish off with, here are some unusual science facts to share with your children this week....

Venus Spins Backwards:

Unlike most planets, Venus spins backwards in a slow, retrograde rotation, which likely happened due to a massive collision long ago.

• Astronauts Float in Space:

In space, astronauts can float around because there's very little gravity, so everything becomes weightless.

You Can't Burp in Space:

In space, there's no gravity to separate liquids from gas in your stomach, making it impossible to burp!

• It can rain diamonds:

Scientists believe that on planets like Neptune, Uranus, and Saturn, the pressure can cause carbon atoms to crystallize and turn into diamonds.

• Babies Have More Bones Than Adults:

Newborns have about 300 bones, almost 100 more than the 206 adults have, as some bones fuse together during growth.

• Humans Get Taller in Space:

In space, there's no gravity pulling them down, so astronauts can grow slightly taller!

• Your Body Creates Millions of Cells Every Second:
