COVID Update

Please can we ask that with the ongoing changing of the rules, if your child tests positive for COVID you do not send them into school. I would ask that parents ensure, that children test negative before they return or stay at home for 5 days whichever is the sooner. In line with new government guidance, we are not insisting on a negative test, however Newcastle Local Authority and Public Health England are

supporting schools in asking parents to help us to minimise the spread of COVID, by asking for a negative test.

Attendance Officer

We have a new Attendance officer working with school, called Grant Short. He is here to support both yourselves and school with improving pupil's attendance, if concerns arise he may well contact you via phone or visit you at your house to help support you in encouraging your children to attend school. We need our children school on a daily basis to be able to learn.

Drop off late and collect early

This week it has been particularly noticeable that a number of our children are being dropped off late and/or collected early. If this is 10 minutes either side of the day that is 20minutes which equals 1hr 40mins of missed education every week. This is going to be monitored and the attendance officer may need to speak to you about reducing these incidents as it will have a detrimental effect on your child's education.
