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Dear parents/carers of children in Year 6,

As I am sure you are all well aware, the end of Key Stage Two assessments, commonly referred to as SATs, are almost upon us. As a year 6 teaching team, we could not be prouder of the hard work, determination and resilience that the children have shown so far and we know they will be fantastic on the week itself.

The children in Year 6 have become very used to what will be expected of them in SATs week; any children with specific access arrangements (such as extra time, modified tests, a reader or a prompter) will now be accessing these daily.

As a reminder, I have included the dates of the SATs below:

Monday 9 <sup>th</sup> May 2022	English – Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (short questions) and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (spelling)
Tuesday 10 <sup>th</sup> May 2022	English - Reading
Wednesday 11 <sup>th</sup> May 2022	Mathematics – Arithmetic (Paper 1) and Mathematics – Reasoning (Paper 2)
Thursday 12 <sup>th</sup> May 2022	Mathematics – Reasoning (Paper 3)

On the morning of each day (Monday to Thursday) of SATs week, we invite your child to join us for a revision breakfast, beginning at 8am. We will provide a range of breakfast food and drinks for the children to enjoy, while their teachers lead them through some calm revision and activities to help them focus and prepare for each day's assessment.

During SATs week, we will be revising with the children each afternoon, preparing for the next day's assessment. Some children may want to do some extra revision when they get home, which is a fantastic, hard-working attitude to have; however, we will also tell the children that it is far more important that they spend some time doing activities that they enjoy after school, getting some fresh air and getting a nice early bed time! We advise that children spend as little time as possible on social media throughout the week, to ensure that they remain focused and calm ahead of their assessments.

We are sure you will support school in ensuring that the week is as stress-free as possible for your children. As always, your continued support is appreciated.
