Dear Parents/carers,

A warm welcome back after the Easter holidays, although they seem like a distant memory! I have been so impressed that the children have come back to school refreshed and happy, ready for an exciting summer term. There are a number of events planned for later on this term, so some of this letter will include early notice for you to add events into the diary.

Lambs

Last week, the lambs were kindly brought into school on Wednesday, for everyone to enjoy and support. All the children really had a wonderful day, as I am sure you have seen through some of the photos which have been posted on Facebook. I am not going to lie, I really wanted to take one home with me, they were wonderful. A huge thank you to Daisy, in Year 5, and her mum and dad for their generous time and patience in both bringing the lambs into school for the day and letting every child stroke the lambs and ask questions. We really appreciated it, I am sure it was a day none of our children will forget.

Tony Peek, a published poet, has been in school all of this week working with all the classes. The children's response has been fantastic and they all report that they have had a wonderful time and really enjoyed working with him. A huge thank you for all of his time and patience with our fabulous children. Dance

I am delighted to announce that we have managed to secure a 10-week block of specialist dance teaching for all classes. The year groups will be split into two sets of 5 week blocks the first of which will start tomorrow, pupils will be able to wear their PE kit.

There will also be an additional after school session just for the Year 6 pupils starting on Wed 17th May 2023 to learn some of the dances for their summer performance. This club will be run from 3:30pm – 4:30pm.

Coronation Day Celebrations

As a school, we are going to celebrate the King's Coronation on Friday 5th May 2023. We are asking children to come into school dressed in any combination or single colour of Red, White and Blue (No football strips please). Pupils will take part in a wide variety of activities in their classes linked to both this and previous coronations.

NEU Strike Action

As you may have seen in the news, the National Education Union (NEU) has voted for strike action for teaching staff on <u>Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May 2023</u>. Currently, there is only one class due to be shut on 27th April and those parents affected have been texted directly. As soon as I know more about the 2nd May, I will let you all know.

Teaching staff at our school have a legal right to take part in the planned strike action, however, it is important to emphasise that the dispute and strike action is not specific to our school. The industrial action is in relation to the NEU's dispute with the Government over the nationally agreed pay rises when considering the pressures faced by staff with the increased cost of living which we are all experiencing. It is a national issue, affecting all schools in England.

There is also a risk that teaching and support staff at our school might be impacted if their own children's school is closed. It is possible that some staff may need to take last minute time off to care for their own children, as a result of actions outside of our control. We will closely monitor this situation.

Please be assured that we shall do everything reasonably possible to keep the school open, provided that we are satisfied we have enough staff in school to comply with our legal obligations and duty of care to pupils.

If we feel this is not possible and we need to consider closing the school (to some or all pupils), then we shall try and provide you with as much notice as possible of this decision. This could be a whole school closure, or we may need to consider reducing pupil numbers by limiting attendance on the above strike days.
