# SEMH Support

I am delighted to let you know that plans have been worked on over the last few months and we are now in a position to open up our very own Social Emotional and Mental Health support hub in school. This is a fabulous new resource, initially staffed in the afternoons by Mrs Sibbet. She will be working with small groups of children and individual children who school and/or parents have identified as benefitting from extra support. We are sure that this will become a fabulous new addition to the support package we offer in school.



## **Counselling**

We continue to benefit from Violetta from the Road Centre working in school every week. She works with children on an individual basis or group basis. I know that the children who she has supported this academic year have benefitted from her expertise.

### Attendance in school

As you will all know, schools have a duty to ensure that all of our pupils attend school as much as possible. If your child is not in school it is much more difficult for them to access their learning. Since Easter, we have returned to sending out the traffic light letters to parents for the first time since COVID. I know that balancing the needs of keeping your children healthy and well and attending school is often tricky for parents, but please be assured that we will always contact you if your child is not well whilst in school. If your child is absent, please always make sure you contact school and let us know the reason why, first thing in the morning.

**Grant Short**, the attendance support officer, will contact you if your child is regularly absent with no reason, or if your child attendance is causing us concern. Some parents have been issued with parental contracts to try and best support them to improve their child's attendance.

**Holidays** – I have had an ever-growing number of holiday request forms from families, and whilst I understand that a large number of these are from postponed holidays during COVID, it is concerning that so many families are asking for time off. Grant Short may contact you to offer some advice.

**Sickness** - If your child has been vomiting or diarrhoea then we ask that they are kept off for 48hours after the last symptom. This is really important to prevent the spread of the bugs around the class to all the other children, especially our more vulnerable children. Several parents have contacted school expressing concern about children coming into school the day after they have been sick, whilst attendance is hugely important we also ask you to be considerate of the other families in school.

**Attendance rewards** - Every week the class with the highest attendance in KS1 and KS2 receives the recognition of that in Golden Book Assembly and the whole class are given 5 mins extra playtime sometime in the following week as a reward.
