# COVID-19

As you are all aware the numbers of positive COVID-19 cases continue to increase in Newcastle. Until the government issues a change to national guidance, we as a school will continue to operate under strict COVID risk assessments. These involve school working very closely with Public Health England on possible bubble closures due to positive cases. Despite what you hear in the news, none of the current guidance around possible bubble closures has changed and none of these decisions are taken lightly. It is infinitely better for all of our pupils to be in school all of the time. I continue to hope and pray that we will not need to close any more bubbles during the last three weeks of term, nevertheless we will also always work in the best interests to keep your children, staff and the community as safe as possible.

### Uniform and hairstyles

I am aware that over the last few weeks that not all of our families are following the schools published uniform policy. It is available for everyone on the school website for anyone to read. Some children are wearing trainers for the last few weeks of school, which we have allowed as they have grown out of school shoes and due to the financial hit of COVID do not want to buy new shoes for three weeks. However, from September 2021, the full uniform policy will be back in place. This also refers to hairstyles, we continually ask parents not to have tramlines and extreme haircuts in their child's hair; nevertheless, some of our boys in particular, are currently competing for the most extreme style; once again I ask for parental support in enforcing our uniform policy. From September, all pupils who continue to flout the rules on uniform will be reminded about the policy and parents will be encouraged to help their child to follow school rules.

As always staff, Governors and I continue to keep you and all of your families in our thoughts and prayers.
