Partnership Agreement and Co-operation Between Parents and the School:

Your agreement and co-operation with the school's ethos and Behaviour Policy is vital to your child's success while a pupil at St John Vianney Catholic Primary School.

We believe that it is vital for us to work together to promote the Values:

- √ Taking responsibility for your own behaviour.
- √ Making positive choices about our behaviours.
- $\sqrt{}$ Trying to do our best.
- $ec{\mathsf{V}}$ Being honest and telling the truth.
- √ Valuing and caring for others.
- \checkmark Caring for the environment and the school building.
- √ Accepting and recognising individual differences.
- $\sqrt{}$ Having respect & being polite to each other.

Assertive Discipline and Positive Behaviour Management:

Rewarding good behaviour must be the norm and is the responsibility of all adults in the school. Public praise, private sanction.

Rewards:

Rewards are given to a child or class when children follow the rules. Rewards need to be frequent, consistent and sure to happen in order to be effective. Praise and rewards are awarded by all staff in and around school as positive reinforcement.

- √ Verbal praise
- √ Stickers
- √ Individual class chart/reward systems
- √ Sharing good work with others such as: Phase Leader, DHT, HT and parents
- √ Individual House Points

- √ Positive Praise Stars
- √ Golden Book Award from the Head teacher
- √ Sporting Values Awards
- √ Half termly 'House winners' incentives

Sanctions:

Sanctions are given to a child or a class when children do not follow the rules. Sanctions need to be consistent and sure to happen in order to be effective. Staff always endeavour to be fair and honest, and to be prepared to apologise if they have made a misjudgement. There is a fresh start everyday.

- × Level 1: Non-verbal warning
- × Level 2: Verbal warning / reminder
- × Level 3: Move seat or area within class
- × Level 4: Time out in another class age appropriate
- × Level 5: Miss out on break and/or lunch-time privileges time to reflect
- × Level 6: Red card issued by class teacher reflection time and staff follow-up and debrief
- × 2 Red Cards: debrief with class teacher and Phase Leader
- × 3+ Red Cards: debrief with class teacher, Phase Leader, DHT/HT and parents
- × If 4 Red Cards are given: Behaviour Report /formal strategy meeting with parents
- × Fixed term exclusions will be considered if all sanctions and actions have been exhausted or an incident is considered severe. External agencies may become involved.

Bullying, Racism and Peer-on-Peer Abuse will NOT be tolerated at St John Vianney Catholic Primary School:

<u>Bullying</u> is abuse of power by an individual or group with the intent to cause distress. It is deliberately hurtful behaviour which may be physical, verbal, psychological or even sexual in nature. The behaviour is repeated over a sustained period of time. Bullying will not be tolerated and is severely dealt with at St John Vianney Catholic Primary School.

<u>Racism</u> is defined at St John Vianney Catholic Primary School as any incident perceived by the victim as racist. This includes physical assault, name-calling, ridicule, provocative behaviour, comment and refusal to co-operate with other pupils or staff. St John Vianney Catholic Primary School is opposed to all forms of racism and declares that racial harassment or expression of racial prejudice within this school will not be tolerated. All incidents will be formally reported to the Governing Committee.

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Home School Agreement September 2020

COVID 19 Addendum

Our school will:

Respect parents' decision if they choose to not take up a school place before September. No attendance fines will be issued

Continue to provide home learning support during the pandemic period

Remind staff to comply with social distancing guidance inside and outside of school

Stay alert for any children or staff demonstrating symptoms of the virus and send them home

Organise pupils and staff into working 'bubbles' of no more than 15

Ensure tables and work areas in 'bubbles' area are as socially spaced as possible

Remind staff and children to come to school in clean clothing

Stagger arrival and collection times and points to enable pupils and adults to socially distance

Organise the premises and pupil movement in a way that reduces contact with other pupils, e.g. having designated 'bubble' areas, toilets and playgrounds

Zone outdoor areas to restrict contact between the different groups

Provide pupils with their own personal equipment/small group equipment for use only by them

Provide cleaning equipment for teachers' and teaching assistants' use in all 'bubble' areas

Follow cleaning routines to keep the premises clean throughout the day

Provide soap and sanitiser for use by children throughout the school

Teach and reinforce safe hand hygiene and respiratory hygiene at all times

Ensure shared resources and toys are cleaned at least once a day

Regularly review risk assessments, taking account the changing situation relating to the coronavirus and subsequent emerging government guidance

Inform parents of any new changes in guidance for schools

Ensure learning focuses on pupils' health and Well-being, PSHE, English and Maths

Discuss the 'children will....' section when pupils come to school and as needed

Parents will:

Inform school if they do not wish to take up a school place and keep in touch if things change

Give school 2 days' notice if they wish their child to take up a place

Comply with government guidance on social distancing for themselves and their children outside of school in order to minimize the risk to the health and wellbeing of other children and staff

Not bring their child into school if they have any coronavirus symptoms, or are unwell in any way

Inform the school in advance if they are not bringing their child to school

Ensure the school has up-to-date emergency contact numbers for their child

 $\textbf{Make contact with the school either via year group or office email or phone and not expect face-to-face meetings$

Arrive at drop off and collect their children from school at the times allocated to them. This must be strictly adhered to. There must be no early or late drop off/collections.

One person should drop off/collect to minimise numbers on school site

Leave site promptly, not stopping to chat to other parents

Ensure their child only brings a packed lunch in a plastic bag (with items they can independently open), water bottle, hat and sun cream (to be applied independently) to school

Understand that no other equipment can be delivered to school during the day. Forgotten items such as coats, packed lunches, water bottles etc can not be taken to class 'bubbles' by school staff.

Ensure their child comes to school in freshly washed suitable clothing every day, with shoes they can fasten independently

Practice hand hygiene rules at home

Discuss the 'children will....' section with their child before they come to school

Understand that if their child cannot follow the school rules they will need to return to home learning until a time that they can follow the rules in accordance with our Covid 19 Behaviour Policy.

Support all staff in their efforts to create an 'as safe as possible' environment during this crisis

Pupils will:

Follow our school rules and values

Behave well at all times to maintain the safety of myself and others

Stay two metres (3 big steps) away from other children as much as possible

Not mix with other children that are not in their group

Tell an adult if they feel unwell

Try hard to not to touch other people

Not touch other people's things

Only bring their packed lunch in a disposable bag and water bottle to school $% \left\{ 1,2,\ldots ,n\right\}$

Mobile phones must be switched off and kept on their person throughout the day. No mobile phones will be kept in the office or by any staff. If phones are switch on and used by pupils, they will be confiscated by staff.

Wash their hands when they arrive at school, before and after they eat, after they have been to the toilet and whenever the adult tells them to

Wash their hands carefully with soap for 20 seconds

Cough or sneeze into their arm or catch it in a tissue. Catch it, kill it, bin it!

Only play with the toys they are told they can

Only use their own equipment for their table and learning area

Stay where the teacher tells them to in the school building and playground

Follow these expectations and understand that, 'If I don't, I will need to go home and will not be able to come back into school until I can be safe.'

Together we will ensure that your child achieves his/her best in all aspects of school life.
