Unfortunately, we are still seeing high numbers of cases in Newcastle. <u>https://www.gov.uk/coronavirus</u> Wherever possible, please follow the national guidance. If a member of your household has received a positive PCR test result then we now ask that the rest of the family access a PCR test prior to any siblings coming into school. On receipt of a negative PCR any other children can immediately return to school, but this extra layer of accessing PCR test will really help us to control against the spread of infection. I really appreciate your support and help with this as we want all of our children to remain in school as much as possible.
