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Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a wonderful first three weeks, and all of our children have settled in beautifully – they are so sensible and a real credit to our school community. This is really an exciting time to be in our school and you will see below that there are a number of forms we would like you to complete and send back to school.

# Entry/exit from school

I have so appreciated your patience and support as we work through our new entrance and exit routines. The pupils are coming into school so well and it has massively reduced the number of pupils who are late in the morning, which is fantastic news for everyone's learning. It is wonderful that everyone wants to be in school at 8:40am, long may that continue, we ask that pupils arrive at the school gate between 8:40am and 8:50am s that they can Walk straight round to their classroom, without the need to hang around in the yard, especially as the weather turns colder. Please remember that pupils arriving late for school will be marked as late and the attendance officer will work with you if this becomes a persistent problem.

Some of our Reception Parents are currently still walking their reception children down into the yard in the morning, however we ask that you all stand next to the fence in a line to wait to drop off your child. Some of our reception children are already happy to walk down themselves and as others grow in confidence they can also start to walk down independently, it is fabulous to see. Our aim is that by Monday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2021 <u>ALL</u> of our reception starters will walk into school, between 8:40am – 8:50m on their own, waving goodbye to parents/grandparents at the gate.

In the afternoon, we ask that all our parents who are waiting to collect siblings stand up near the bicycle shelter or on the Reception grass patch. Currently, with parents standing in the main exit it is difficult for others to leave without walking through groups of people. Your support and help in this matter are as always, appreciated.

# **Curriculum Evenings**

Normally, in the first few weeks of term, we would invite families into school to give them the opportunity to meet the children's new class teachers and find out about what they will be doing and learning in the year ahead. However, as we begin the term cautiously and with everyone's safety in mind, we have decided not to deliver these in the way we ordinarily would, in person. Instead, class teachers will produce a presentation and upload it onto the school website, they should all be available on the school website from Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September.

### **School Houses**

The new House groups are being launched next week and they will be:

St Bede, St Cuthbert, St Aidan, St Hilda, St Bega and St Anne. Over the coming weeks all pupils will be introduced to their new houses and start to learn something about their saint, however if pupils want to research their saint at home and then amaze their teachers with some facts they have found out that would be wonderful!

Pupils will be given house points as rewards for doing something positive, be that hard work or polite manners etc. These points will be collated weekly and the weekly winning house will be recognized

and at the end of each half term the overall winning house with the greatest number of points will receive a popcorn and film afternoon as a reward for their collective group effort.

This reward will of course run alongside the current weekly Golden Book Awards, which the children really enjoy and are rightly proud of receiving. It is certainly the highlight of my week, celebrating success and positivity in school with the children.

#### PE Value Awards

As we start the new academic year we are now going to re-instate the PE Value Awards celebrating positive examples of Teamwork, Passion, Respect, Determination, Self-belief and Honesty. We know that our children are able to be exemplary role models and want to celebrate and recognize them in their efforts. These awards will be given out in Golden book Assembly.

#### Reception/Year 6 Buddies

Our reception children have now been in school for a few weeks and they are settling in so well. This week they had the chance to meet their new Year 6 'Buddy' who are there to support and help them in and around school. The Year 6 children are so excited by this new responsibility and as a great start they have gifted all their buddies with a new St John Vianney teddy. We encourage all of our reception children to take their SJV teddy out with them on family trips and adventures and take photos to bring into school to share with their friends and their buddy. Over the course of the year the Year 6 and Reception children will meet up and spend treat time together.

### Acceptable use policy

The reason is that we do not want any accidents and children can get hurt if ears are caught by accident, most especially when our children are taking part in PE and daily playtime.

Of course, at school pupils are taught about online safety both as part of the curriculum but we always appreciate your support and help as well.
