English

Poetry: Poems on a Theme – 'In Flanders Fields' by John McCrae

Children will read, recite and write poems, including Acrostic and Blackout poems.

Biography Writing - Little People: Big Dreams: David Attenborough

Children will write a Factfile and Biography about David Attenborough.

Grammar: Ensure that the children use and understand the correct terminology, e.g. parts of speech, sentence construction and punctuation.
